## March is Reading Month: Getting 'Book'ed

With March serving as National Reading Month, Lapeer Community Schools participated in various activities across the month.

National Reading Month is a celebration that encourages reading for all ages and promotes reading as a key feature for learning, social, and professional development.

From Dressing Like a Book Character Day to Harry Potter Day to having “masked readers” to having a visit from the Scripps family and WXYZ-TV’s Glenda Lewis to give away free books at Schickler Elementary (*pictured above*), this month is always one that the District looks forward to every school year.

“Seeing and hearing about all our students taking part in March is Reading Month and enjoying it never gets old,” says Michelle Bradford, LCS Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction. “Reading is something that these kids will use in their daily lives as they get older and move on to higher levels of education, and we couldn’t be more thrilled with all the positive feedback we get every year from this monthly event.”

Lizzie Hutton, director of the Howe Writing Center at Miami (Ohio) University, says reading is prevalent anywhere you look.

## Reading Month piques student interest (cont'd)

“One thing that’s really important for educators to do is just raise awareness that reading really is already everywhere,” says Hutton. “We read texts from friends, recipes and instructions, street signs, and emails. What can help students with their reading is recognizing all the reading skills — and goals for reading — that they already have in place, and then building on those skills and goals to meet new demands.”

LCS Superintendent Matt Wandrie says the importance of reading goes way beyond the classroom.

“Reading is a skill that will help take anyone where they want to go,” Wandrie says. “We have amazing and dedicated teachers here that teach these kids not only how to read, but how to maintain that skill by encouraging them to keep reading, whether that is a book, magazine, tablet, whatever that may be. We have a phenomenal staff here at LCS.”

Hutton adds that reading will always be important.

“It’s important that students think about all the different kinds of reading they can and will do in and out of the classroom — reading to revise a text or learn from a text, reading critically or in order to respond to something, reading to

synthesize information,” says Hutton. “Thinking about the different ways we read then gives us insight into the different kinds of attention we also bring to different writing tasks — and how reading critically can help us exercise the muscles we use when we write in a more critical mode.

“Students need lots of opportunities to do all different kinds of reading and writing for their classes so they can develop a strong sense of the range of types of textual engagement that are already all around them.”

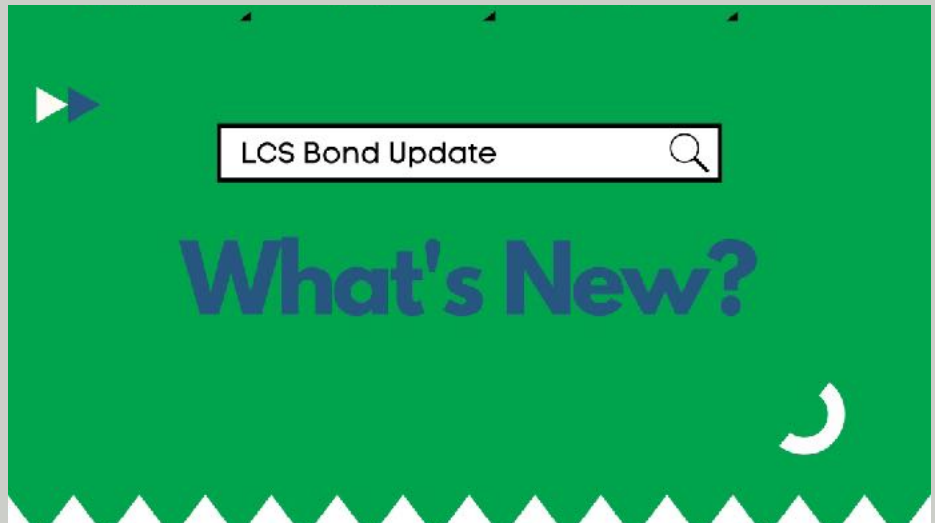
## LCS Bond Projects Update: March/April 2024

Back in March 2023, we posted our first invitations to bid for our safety and security packages.

We are now at the point where bids have been accepted and are now working through the construction phase of our HVAC work at the elementary schools as well as gym additions and laying the groundwork for science room, weight room and multi-purpose rooms at Lapeer High School.

We will work with individual buildings to identify the specific areas being impacted by our spring/summer renovation schedule.

The Center For Innovation (CFI) demolition and parking lot expansion is complete and we are currently working on site restoration. We are also moving along with safety and security upgrades.

## Health & Safety News



Stop the Silence. Help End the Violence.

From LCS Health, Safety, Operations and Athletic Administrator Joe Wood:

Over the past few months, our district Command Team has been meeting to further strengthen both our physical and practical safety and security. The team has created an action list based on the security assessment that our district completes every 2 years. As a result of the past few meetings, there has been a number of things completed throughout the district. One of those is the update to our OK2Say initiative. Each building was given a number of promotional items to display throughout the school. We have worked within our processes to identify key members of the Command Team that will serve as points of contact.

Per the state of Michigan, “OK2SAY is the student safety program that allows students to confidentially report tips on potential harm or criminal activities directed at students, school employees, and schools. It uses a comprehensive communication system to facilitate tip sharing among students, parents, school personnel, community mental health service programs, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, and law enforcement officials about harmful behaviors that threaten to disrupt the learning environment.”

We encourage students and staff to speak up if they see something that should be reported. Many acts of violence are known by others before they are carried out, people often do not report because they are worried about retaliation or rejection from their peers. The OK2Say tool allows students to report concerning behavior anonymously, eliminating the stigma of reporting to authorities.

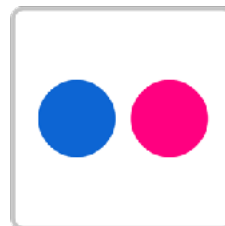

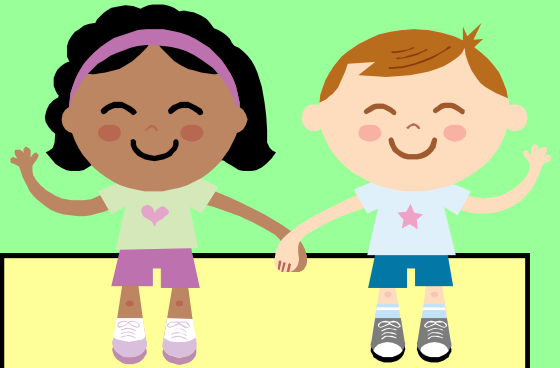

Learn more about your risk for heart disease, certain cancers and depression with the free MediKeeper app.

MESSA has partnered with MediKeeper to give our members a helpful tool for assessing their health and identifying risks for certain cancers, diabetes, heart disease, osteoporosis, depression and other illnesses.

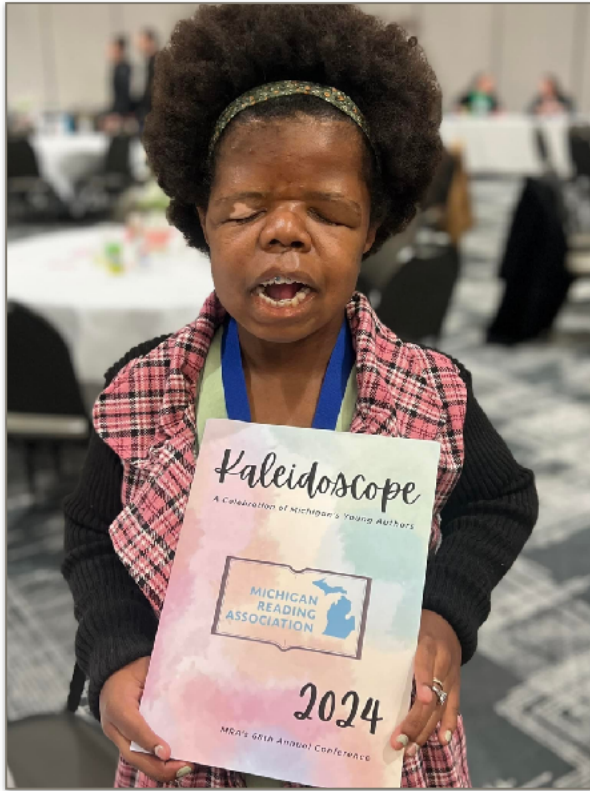
Users fill out a detailed questionnaire, which is used to generate a personal health profile, including their lifetime risk for up to 16 major diseases and conditions.

MediKeeper also gives users individual feedback, suggestions to lower their risks and a personal wellness plan. Users can share the reports with their doctor to address any concerns. To protect your privacy, your personal data is *not* accessible by MESSA, your employer or any other third party.

**The MediKeeper health risk assessment is accessible on a smartphone, tablet or computer. To access the tool, members should log into their online MyMESSA account at [messa.org](http://messa.org).**

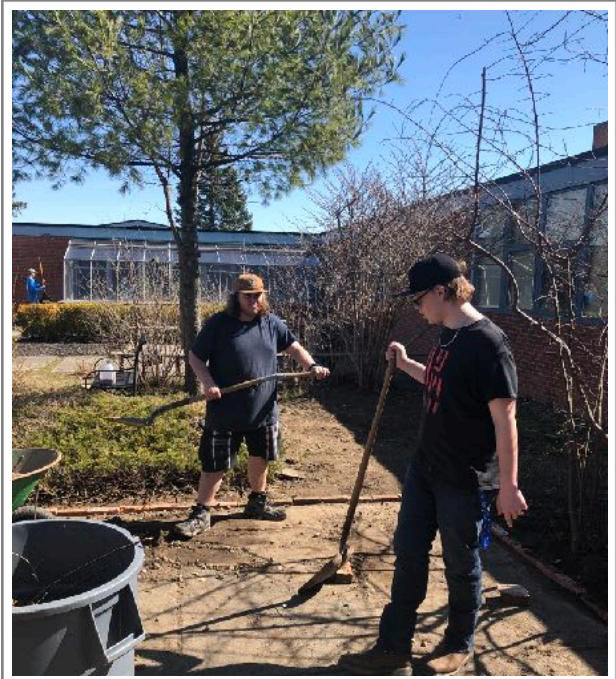

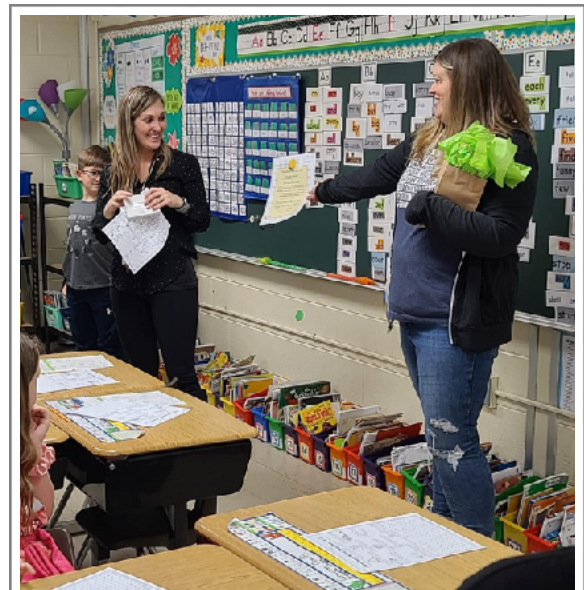

Many of you will be receiving **Form 1095-C**, (Employer Provided Health Insurance Offer and Coverage) in the mail in the next few days.

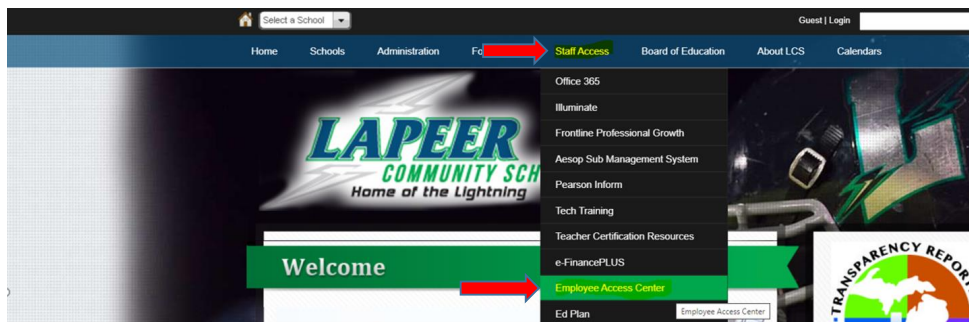
Form 1095-C shows whether the employer offered health insurance coverage and for how long. (Part-time Employees/Subs/Coaches - may not receive a 1095-C.)

You can also access this document online in the Employee Access Center. (**See instructions below**)

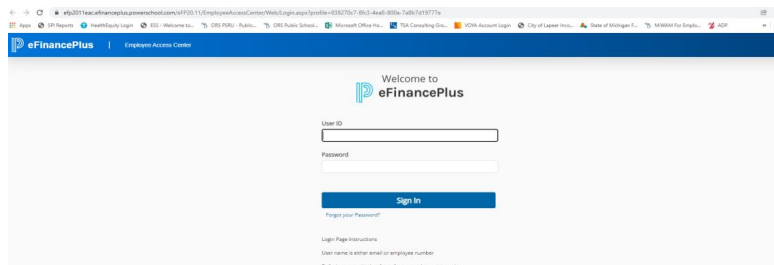
**\*\*In most cases, you do not need to wait for the Form 1095-C in order to file your U.S. Individual Income Tax Return (IRS Form 1040, 1040A, or 1040EZ). Most employees will know whether they had health coverage for a month and can simply check a box on their tax return to attest that they, their spouse (if filing jointly), and any eligible dependents had "minimum essential coverage" throughout the year.\*\***

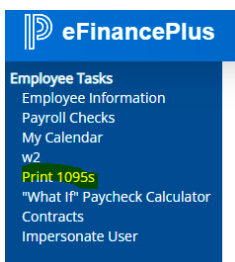
